Notable MARQUES Achievements during 2010

Input into study on trade mark system in Europe:

MARQUES members and Teams have been highly active in the past year in providing input into the European Commission's study on the functioning of the trade mark system in Europe, conducted by the Max Planck Institute in Germany. MARQUES has submitted written comments, alongside other users' groups, and took part in a two-day discussion of user requirements in Munich in June. Together with AIM and BUSINESSEUROPE, MARQUES submitted a memo identifying areas where trade mark offices can harmonise procedures. The Association has set up and maintained a page on the MARQUES website providing updates and background material on the study.

Representation before WIPO:

A delegation representing MARQUES visited WIPO's offices in Geneva in April and held meetings with senior WIPO officials.

MARQUES also attended the 2nd session of the WIPO Working Group on the Development of the Lisbon System and the WIPO Advisory Committee on Enforcement.

Trade Mark User Forum:

The 10th Trademark User Forum in Europe – a meeting between MARQUES, AIM, BUSINESSEUROPE and the national PTOs – was held in Brussels in March. The one-day seminar, the latest in a series, enabled users and national offices to discuss trade mark issues of concern.

Judges Meeting:

The third **MARQUES** Judges Meeting will be held in Munich, at the premises of the German PTO, in December 2010.

OHIM engagement:

Representatives of relevant **MARQUES** Teams attended the 17th **OHIM**'s Users Group Meeting in Alicante in March. **MARQUES** was also invited to attend a meeting on e-business at **OHIM** in May and it continues to have observer status on **OHIM**'s Administrative Board and Budget Committee.

Representation before the European Commission:

MARQUES has secured itself representation in the **European Commission**'s register of representatives, and prepared submissions to the EC's consultation on the review of the EU laws on customs enforcement of IP rights. In May a **MARQUES** delegation met with the EC Director for Knowledge-Based Economy in DG MARKT, Margot Fröhlinger, in Brussels. **MARQUES** has made representations to the **European Commission** to be admitted to the Observatory on Counterfeiting and Piracy as an Interested Representative Association.

UNCITRAL:

MARQUES was represented at the **UNCITRAL** Working Group VI, Session number 42, held in Vienna in March 2010. The meeting led to the publication of the **UNCITRAL** Legislative Guide on Secured Transactions, Supplement on Security Rights in Intellectual Property.

Events for Members:

The 2010 Annual Conference in Berlin was coordinated by the Programming Team, with the theme being MARQUES Reloaded. The Winter Meeting 2010 was held in Nice and other meetings during the year included a designs seminar in Paris and a trade marks roundtable in Düsseldorf. Various MARQUES Teams have worked on themed sessions and workshops for these and future events.

Amicus Curige Team

- Submissions in the case Nokia Corporation v Her Majesty's Commissioners of Revenue & Customs (HMRC) to UKIPO and Polish Ministry of Economy supporting the view that goods in transit can be seized.
- Submission to the Gerechtshof Den Haag on the decision on Leno Merken BV v Hagelkruis Beheer bv (ONEL/OMEL case) supporting the view that Article 15 (1) CTMR should be interpreted in a way that it does not depend on the use of the trade mark in a specific number of EU member states but takes into account all facts and circumstances of the individual case, in line with MARQUES position paper.

- Table of EU regulations, international agreements and EU bilateral treaties on GIs and a table of databases on protected GIs in the EU, Lisbon and OHIM databases.
